From Jane Skinner

"Psalm 9.1 I will give thanks to you, Lord, with my whole heart; I will tell of all your marvellous works. Reflection: Being actively thankful, as is mentioned in this psalm, is like pouring petrol on the flames of your hope. I was in a church service once. In a quiet moment between songs, one man started listing the things – big and small – that God had done for him that week. At first, nobody quite knew what to do, but within minutes, the whole room was doing the same thing. I spoke to that man after the service, thanking him for kicking off such a powerful moment. He told me how he had come to church feeling hopeless – and so he decided to fight that hopelessness with thankfulness. This is why Paul tells us to be thankful in all circumstances, because it's a tool with which we can demolish hopelessness." These words were today's LivingHope Lent reflection from the Church of England.
