In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus meets with the disciples on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias. Jesus asks Peter if he, Peter, loves Him. Peter assures Jesus of his love, to which He gives Peter the charge "Feed my sheep." We have the twin themes of love and feeding, the exchange between Peter and Jesus resounds with us today. We too are disciples, followers of Jesus, so the charge laid upon Peter to 'feed my sheep' is ours also. We cannot escape the responsibility although we have been extremely remiss about it. We are charged with 'feeding the sheep.' To continue the farming analogy, where are the sheep? There are few in the shed, there are many out in the field and that is where we must be, out in the field not waiting in the shed, or church. Love needs to be shared, God's love needs to be shared, out in the field as much if not more in the field than in the shed. Andrew
